Civmec is proud to offer assistance to charities and community groups where it can in the form of corporate sponsorships and donations. This overview provides a guideline detailing Civmec's sponsorship plan, policy and application form. As we have a limit to our resources, this policy allows us to distribute funds and support those groups in most need in a fair and effective manner.

Sponsorship is defined as a business arrangement where services/opportunities to the value of the sponsorship are provided in return for cash or in-kind services. It should provide a real benefit to the community and/or be a cost effective means of achieving an organisations' marketing and communication objectives.

Donation is defined as the provision of goods to a registered charity, organisation or individual where a receipt for the value of goods can be provided for taxation purposes.

Our sponsorship proposal is based around supporting local community organisations/individuals, that are usually non-profit groups/individuals who generally would not be able to fund operations and activities without external financial assistance.

Both parties are committed to maximising participation to achieve a mutually agreed outcome. It may apply to one-off events, but often applies to community programmes extending over many months or even years. Partnerships include giving support, such as providing cash to, say, a local children's sporting team that wouldn't be able to participate without assistance.

All submission must be made and completed based on the provided application form. Please allow us six weeks to review your application.

Each request will be carefully assessed to determine if it meets Civmec's sponsorship and community objectives. We are unable to proceed with requests for support that do not fit within these objectives. In addition, financial constraints limit the number of sponsorships that we can undertake.

Organisations/activities which will not be considered for sponsorship by Civmec include, but are not limited to, those which:

- may be construed as discriminatory;
- could be detrimental to public health or safety;
- promote or encourage smoking or substance abuse;
- programs that may present a hazard to the community or the environment;
- programs that contribute to the financial gain of an individual or business;
- activities which are the direct responsibility of the Government;
- non-specific fundraising projects or appeals; and/or
- an organisation with which sponsorship involvement could be misinterpreted as a bribe or kickback (for example, to influence a bidding or tender process).
